President and CEO Message

The Family Y has been an important cornerstone in our community for over 130 years. The YMCA started in Owen Sound in 1877 and the YWCA in 1920. After an amalgamation between the two organizations to form the Owen Sound YM-YWCA in 1966, the organization became the Family Y in 1991. Since its early beginnings, the Family Y has been dedicated to building a caring, healthy community by creating opportunities for all people to achieve personal growth in spirit, mind and body. The Family Y has done this by welcoming all people, regardless of background, economic status, age, gender, ability, race or religion, and by providing programs and services throughout Grey and Bruce Counties that meet their needs.

Over the years, the types of programs and services have evolved to keep in tune with changing community needs. Early fitness and recreation programs of swimming lessons, basketball leagues and bowling have evolved to swimming lessons for all ages from 6 months to seniors, basketball drop-in, and individualized fitness programs. Seniors programs have been developed to serve our active aging population. Aquafit, Gentle Fit, Joints in Motion, Yoga, Pilates and stretch classes all add to the wellness of seniors and adults of all ages in our community. Games and residential camp for children have evolved into sports programs, day camps, overnight camp and child care. Reading rooms, discussion groups and a boarding house for young women moving into the city to finish school or to start work have evolved into employment programs and housing support.

Our strong history provides our base as we move forward to achieve our vision for the future to make a positive difference to the health and well-being of our community, of building our community through the provision of values-based programs and services that reflect our community's needs. The financial assistance program helps to ensure that all are able to participate, no matter what their financial situation. In the tough economic times this past year, financial assistance increased by 20%, to over 500 people. We are very proud to be able to lend a helping hand when it is needed most, and to continue to build a strong community through all challenges!

The Family Y builds strong communities through child care, employment, housing support, alternative justice programs, day camp, overnight camp and health, fitness and recreation programs, providing all people with the opportunities and supports necessary to achieve the social determinants of health.

Health, Fitness & Recreation

The first Y facility on 3rd Avenue East at 10th Street opened in December 1906. It was built at a cost of \$20,000 and included a swimming tank in the basement. In 1967, the second facility opened at 640 2nd Avenue East. Built at a cost of \$980,000, it was a full service facility with gymnasium, pool, meeting rooms and locker rooms. Both facilities were built to respond to growing community needs, and were only possible because of dedicated volunteers and strong community support for a capital fundraising campaign.

In the spring of 2009, the City of Owen Sound and the Family Y partnered on a grant application for infrastructure funds for a new regional recreation centre. This was as a result of ten years of work by these two partners and the Township of Georgian Bluffs and the Municipality of Meaford on a regional Task Force, and 20 years of foresight by the Better Pool Committee! On June 9, 2009, the application was successful and the City of Owen Sound received approval for \$21.7 million to build a Regional Recreation Centre in partnership with the Family Y. Two ice pads and a Family Y will be built on the Victoria Park site.





The birth of a third Y building is the next stage of evolution in addressing the increasing health needs of our community. The Y health, fitness and recreation component of the new facility will include:

- An aquatic centre with a 25 metre 8 lane pool for fitness swimming, aquafit, swim instruction and competition, and a warm water leisure and therapy pool with shallow entry, water play features and a relaxation alcove with water jets.
- A multi-sport gymnasium
- A conditioning centre with strength training and cardio equipment, free weights and space for yoga, cycling, etc
- A walking/running track 12 laps to the mile
- And multi-purpose rooms for babysitting, meetings and children's programs.

A \$5 million fundraising campaign is being led by the Family Y for this regional facility. An excellent group of volunteers sit on the Fundraising Committee, which is co-chaired by Sonya Mount and Tom Rice. As in the development of facilities in the past, community donations are necessary to achieve the vision of a new centre for the Family Y and Grey and Bruce Counties.

Y health, fitness and recreation programs build our community by ensuring that all community members have the opportunity to grow, develop and participate with their friends and neighbours in a health enhancing environment. Currently over **3,100 people** are members at the Y and over **1,000** more participate in Y programs. **Over 500, or 17% received financial assistance**. There were **1,628 children** participating in **Y day camp and in Harrison Park day camp**, which is run by the Family Y on behalf of the City. And **541 campers** participated at **Camp Presqu'ile**, operated by the Family Y in partnership with the Owen Sound Rotary Club.

Community & Employment Services

The Community & Employment Services department of the Owen Sound Family YMCA is all about building and supporting a strong local community. A variety of employment programs ensure that people are able to find employment to support themselves and their families. Many people are able to find work on their own; they may already have the skills that are in demand to succeed in today's labour market. Others need assistance to navigate through the often confusing array of programs and services to find work or to find the right training that will give them a better chance of securing a good paying job.

It is surprising to many people that housing is as much of an issue locally as it is. We would all agree that adequate shelter is an essential need in any community. In our current economy most communities are in need of "affordable housing". Last year **over 2,000** people/families sought out the **Family Y Housing Support Program** for assistance to either retain their current housing, learn about finding affordable, adequate housing, or, in emergencies, to locate shelter for one to several nights until something permanent could be arranged. Supporting people with their housing problems can be viewed as another piece of social infrastructure that, although virtually invisible to most, is essential to healthy communities.

Building communities is also accomplished by providing a means for those who have caused harm to the community to take responsibility for their actions and to do so in a meaningful way. Through several **Alternative Justice Programs** and with the help and support of the local judiciary and police services, we ensure offenders who have been involved in minor crime take responsibility for their actions, make reparations to the community by providing community services, and in some cases, face their victims. Some of these interventions involve the victims of crime who have the opportunity to relay how they have been affected by the crime and the impact on them and their family. They may also influence the outcome or consequence of the offender.

Local community resources like those offered by the **Family Y Community & Employment Services** are essential to support people in their journey toward self sufficiency and self fulfillment. This past year, **over 1,100 youth and adults** received employment counseling, **800 students** were assisted in finding summer jobs and there were over **29,000** visits to the employment resource centres in Owen Sound, Walkerton and Hanover. **Over 2,000 people** received housing support, **over 350 people** participated in alternative justice programs such as the **Youth Justice Circle** and **community service orders**, and over **2,100 youth and adults received gambling education**.





Child Care

The Family Y Child Care department offers quality child care for over **1100 families** in Grey and Bruce Counties. Our child care programs reach into many communities, and quite often are the only licensed, quality child care within those communities.

Most individuals do not realize how vital child care programs are for building communities. Licensed child care programs provide necessary support for families, whether they are full day child care centres for pre-schoolers or before and after school programs for 6 to 12 year olds. Our child care programs allow families to maintain employment, continue their education, and provide children with educational and socialization opportunities. Municipalities also rely on licensed child care programs for growth and infrastructure within their communities. Without licensed child cares programs municipalities would struggle to attract new young families into their communities, and without young families moving into their communities the municipality can't grow.

Our child care programs also build communities by providing other agencies with options for needed child care. All of the Owen Sound Family Y child care programs work hand in hand with agencies like CAS, Ontario Works, Preschool Resource and Community Living to offer quality child care for families and children in need. These partnerships are essential for a healthy and productive community.

Licensed, quality child care programs, like those of the Owen Sound Family Y, lay the foundation for building strong kids, strong families and strong communities. We are very proud to be the **largest provider of child care in Grey and Bruce Counties, serving 1,370 children**.







The Family Y looks forward to continuing our work with the City of Owen Sound along with our local municipalities and other partners to ensure the regional recreation centre, our child care services and our community and employment programs effectively meet the needs of all those who live in our Region.


