Message from the President & CEO

This past year was one of celebration and change filled with new learnings, lessons and challenges. We worked to deliver on promises made, to adapt to the changing needs of local children and their families, and to serve those most vulnerable. Our work is supported by many community partners. We are united in our efforts in **putting community first.**

We opened our new YMCA Health and Fitness Facility. In asking for our community's support we made a promise, a promise that this facility would improve the health and wellness of the people of our region. We are excited to say, we are staying true to our word. Membership has increased by 80% and the facility is abuzz from open to close. In talking with participants, we know that the Family Y plays a significant role in their lives. For some it has literally saved their lives, reducing their risk of disease and improving their overall health. For many it is a sanctuary of sorts, a place to call home. While for others it is where their family comes together, their children learn to swim or where friends meet friends. Thank you again to all of those who made our new facility possible - the Government of Canada, the Government of Ontario, the City of Owen Sound, the Township of Georgian Bluffs, over 850 donors and our committed staff and volunteers.

Our YMCA Child Care programs continued to adapt to the changing needs for before and after school, and full day child care with the implementation of Full Day Learning. Ongoing training and learning opportunities ensured our staff were able to provide the highest level of quality programming children require and parents expect. We connected with community stakeholders on various committees that focus on determining what local families need and how we can best support them. Working with municipal partners and school boards, we collaborated on how to serve schools and children better. Children in our programs were engaged in their communities through visits to retirement homes to spend time with seniors, by collecting food for those in need, and by sharing messages of peace during YMCA Peace Week.

A strategic network of community partnerships, and our focus on a "no wrong door" approach enabled YMCA Community & Employment Services to support 1000s of people throughout Grey and Bruce counties this past year. We leveraged our own services as well as those of our partners to keep the door open for those in need, and provide them with the resources necessary to succeed. We aligned with like-minded organizations to bring attention to key issues affecting those in our community. In acknowledging the need for a centralized listing of jobs specific to our region, we created a free online job board. Launched in January 2012, the site receives 400 "hits" per day, and over 350 jobs have been listed.

Our actions are guided by the people of our community and the situations they face on a daily basis. Their needs and the needs of the region influence our decisions and priorities. It is the relationships we have with our many partners, members, donors, and volunteers that enable us to continue **putting community first.**
