

Message from the Board President & CEO

The health of a community reflects the health of its people. Good health is holistic in nature. It includes one's emotional, physical and mental health. When just one component of a persons' health is compromised through circumstances such as job loss, illness or finances, the impact can affect all areas of their life. The collective effect of those individual experiences influences the community as a whole.

In 2013 we began work on a new strategic plan, a plan that builds on our 137 year history and clarifies the role that our organization will play as we build strong, vibrant communities across Grey and Bruce Counties. We believe when people have access to nurturing child care programs, meaningful employment, safe, affordable housing and opportunities for physical activity and play; they can improve their lives, their health and reach their potential.

The national YMCA Playing to Learn Curriculum, along with our caring, qualified staff create an engaging, fun environment in our YMCA Child Care Centres that fosters an enthusiasm for, and love of, life-long learning. In preparation for school, each child's learning experience is built on their individual interests and needs with the goal to guide each child on a path of future success.

Our YMCA Employment Resource Centres provide many free services and educational opportunities to assist people in identifying their goals, developing their skills, gaining experience and securing employment. Last year we had 18,392 visits to our Centres. YMCA Employment Advisors provide direction, resources and encouragement to clients. Programs such as the Youth Employment Fund create opportunities for young adults to learn hands-on skills, earn an income and work towards long-term employment.

Expanded program opportunities, enhanced amenities and added space allow us to deliver better opportunities in health, fitness and aquatics. Many people, including seniors have embraced Tai Chi for its rhythmic, calming movements. Others use the warm water pool to improve their mobility and gain strength. A new program partnership with the Alzheimer Society of Grey-Bruce enables those dealing with Alzheimer's and their caregivers to connect with others to enjoy social and physical activities together.

Our inclusive, caring approach ensures that people of all ages, backgrounds and abilities can participate at the YMCA. Financial circumstance should never be a barrier to opportunity. We strive to treat people with respect and dignity. Through our financial assistance program, we work to ensure that no one is turned away.

We believe that everyone has the right to be their best and reach their true potential; whether they are a child discovering a new talent, a young adult searching for their dream job, or a senior learning to swim. **This is the YMCA.** Every day we help people work towards achieving their goals.


